Healthy Start Vouchers

Do I qualify?

You qualify for Healthy Start if you're at least 10 weeks pregnant or have a child under four years old **and** you or your family get:

- · Income Support, or
- · Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, or
- · Child Tax Credit (with a family income of £16,190 or less per year)
- Universal Credit (with a family take home pay of £408 or less per month)

You also qualify if you are under 18 and pregnant, even if you don't get any of the above.

Benefits of applying:

If you are pregnant or have a child under four years old you could get Healthy Start vouchers to help buy some basic foods. This important means-tested scheme provides vouchers to spend with local retailers.

Pregnant women and children over one and under four years old can get one £4.25 voucher per week.

Children under one year old can get two £4.25 vouchers (£8.50) per week.

What else is Available?

Healthy Start vitamins are suitable for vegetarians and halal diets, and free from milk, egg, gluten, soya and peanut residues. Pregnant women, women with a baby under one year old and children from six months old to their fourth birthday on **Healthy Start** will get green **Healthy Start vitamin** coupons.

How to apply:

The form is a leaflet called Healthy Start which you can get from your midwife or GP

What information do I need to provide?

Personal details
Address
National insurance number

You will be required to ask your midwife to sign the completed form.

Care to Learn

Do I qualify?

- · You're a parent under 20 at the start of your course
- · You're the main carer for your child
- · You live in England you're either a British citizen or a national of a <u>European Economic Area</u> (EEA) country
- · Your course qualifies
- · Your childcare provider qualifies

Benefits of applying:

- · your childcare, including deposit and registration fees
- · a childcare taster session for up to 5 days
- · keeping your childcare place over the summer holidays
- taking your child to their childcare provider

You can get up to:

£160 per child per week if you live outside London

What else is available?

- · Childcare element of tax credits (now part of universal credit—for over 20s
- Free Nursery
- Entitlement for 2 and 3 year olds—subject to eligibility

How to apply?

You must choose your learning provider and childcare provider before you apply.

Your childcare provider is paid from the beginning of your course if you apply either: Before your course starts within 28 days of starting your course. If you apply after that, your childcare provider will only be paid from the beginning of the week that your application was received.

Universal Credit

Do I qualify?

You can currently claim Universal Credit if you're either:

- · A single person anywhere in England, Wales and Scotland
- · A couple or family living in certain areas

To get Universal Credit you must:

- · Be 18 or over be under State Pension age
- · Not be in full time education or training
- · Not have savings over £16,000

Benefits of applying:

Calculators

Use one of the following:

<u>Turn2us</u> - for information on income-related benefits, tax credits, Council Tax Reduction, Carer's Allowance, Universal Credit and how your benefits will be affected if you start work or change your working hours.

<u>entitled to</u> - for information on income-related benefits, tax credits, contribution-based benefits, Council Tax Reduction, Carer's Allowance, Universal Credit and how your benefits will be affected if you start work.

What else is Available?

If you have children

You can make a new Universal Credit claim if you either:

- · Have 2 children or fewer and you live in a Universal Credit area
- · Received Universal Credit in the previous 6 months and your payments have stopped it doesn't matter how many children you have
- · If you have 3 or more children and you haven't claimed Universal Credit before, you can apply for <u>Child Tax Credit</u>

What information do I need to provide?

You will be required to provide the following information:

National insurance number Bank account details Full postal address

Personal details for you, your partner and any children on application

Local Welfare Support

Do I qualify?

You can only get help for non-crisis support if you are receiving a qualifying benefit or expect to be in receipt of a qualifying benefit at the time you apply and there is enough money left in the fund. Qualifying benefits are listed below but please note, if you have savings the value of any award may be reduced.

- . Universal Credit
- Jobseekers Allowance (income based)
- Employment and Support Allowance (income related)
- · Income Support
- · Pension Guaranteed Credit

Benefits of applying:

Basic items, eg, bedding, some essential basic kitchen items. Contact Welfare support on the number below for further support on what may be available.

How to apply?

Collect application from: Hartlepool Civic Centre, Advice and Support HUB.

Alternatively call - 01429 284284 during Office Hours 9am-4.30pm to apply for crisis support.

What information do I need to provide?

You will be required to provide identification and proof of Benefits.

Maternity Grant

Do I qualify?

Usually, to qualify for a Sure Start Maternity Grant there must be no other children in your family and you or your partner must get one of these benefits:

- Income Support
- · income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- · income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit that includes a disability or severe disability element
- Universal Credit

If you already have children you may still be able to get a grant if you're expecting a <u>multiple birth</u> (such as twins or triplets).

Benefits of applying:

You will be entitle to a minimum of £500.

What else is Available?

Further entitlements are available for multiple birth.

How to apply?

Print out and fill in the <u>Sure Start Maternity Grant (SF100) claim form</u>. A health professional (such as a doctor or midwife) must also sign your claim form. Post it to "Freepost DWP SSMG" - you don't need a postcode or stamp.

When you can claim

You can claim from 11 weeks before the week your baby is due. The latest you can claim is 3 months after your baby is born.

One Stop

Do I qualify?

- If you are between 16 and 20
- If you are looked after /leaving care and between 16 and 21
- If you have additional learning needs and between 16 and 25

Benefits of applying:

The One Stop is a service for young people aged between 16 and 19.

We offer an inclusive service from one location where young people can access help and support for a wide range of issues from homelessness to Education, Employment and Training. We can support with CV writing, interview support and employability skills.

- Referral to other agencies
- CV writing
- Career guidance
- Job search facilities
